- **Earn college credit.** A passing score on a CLEP® exam can grant you three to 12 college credits. Utilize your GI Bill tuition benefits by applying those funds toward needed course work.
- **Save time.** Accelerate your degree program by moving directly into higher-level courses.
- **Save money.** Receive full reimbursement from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs for any CLEP exams you take. Check with your VA adviser on your benefit election and eligibility.

- All **33** CLEP exams are administered on computer, offering instant score reports (with the exception of some composition exams).
- Over **2,900** colleges and universities grant credit or advanced standing for satisfactory scores on CLEP exams. Check your college’s credit-granting policy before taking an exam.
- The exams are administered at **1,700** college and on-base test centers across the country.
